ADULT SOFTBALL

- Coed softball began at Tavan September 3. Four teams are playing in a seven game season.
- Men's softball began at Tavan September 6. Six teams are playing in a seven game season.

AQUATICS

- Recreational swim ended September 15.
- Pool parties ended September 15
- Swim lessons ended August 31.
- Lap swimming ended September 27. Water Aerobics ended the regular season September 27.
- Staff began the process of cleaning and putting away equipment for the season.
- A water safety class was held for staff of an adult residential facility September 10.

BROCHURE

- The Fall 2013 Activity Guide was placed on the City of Martinez website the end of. Residents requesting a paper copy by mail are also being obliged.
- Staff has begun working on activities and classes for the 2014 Winter Spring Brochure.
