DISCUSSION:

Waterfront Park: A public workshop was held on March 12th from 7pm to 8:30 pm. The participants suggested a layout with the soccer field located along the south edge of the park. Notes from the meeting are being distilled by the designer. Residents that live in the vicinity of the park voiced their objection to lights. Some were concerned about lights being on late at night while some did not want lights at all. Soccer representatives requested the soccer field be lighted. It was decided that a third workshop be held by the PRMCC Subcommittee prior to going to the full PRMCC and Council. It is likely the workshop will focus primarily on noise and lights.

Hidden Valley Park: The work on this park is substantially completed. The parking lot paving and striping along with the restroom remains to be completed. The contractor removed the construction fencing around the perimeter of the park on March 7th. Portable restrooms were placed until the permanent restrooms are completed. The contractor is finalizing the construction of the structure this week. Electrical and finish plumbing will occur over the next month. The parking lot paving should be completed this week.

Waterfront Restrooms: Bids are due from Romtec and our park contractor Suarez and Munoz at 5pm, February 14th. The City council awarded the purchase order on March 3rd. The project is on schedule for beginning construction in March. It is anticipated per the schedule to take two months to complete. Should the restrooms not be completed by the start of the bocce season the City will provide port-a-potties.

ADA and Playground Improvement Project – Susana Street and Mt. View Parks: Kluber and Associates has been selected to do the design of the project. The Subcommittee has provided comments to the designer. It is likely Mt. View Park will have the play areas centrally located. Susana Street Park will likely have a historical theme as part of the design.
