RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution accepting bids and awarding the construction contract for the Alhambra Avenue Paving, Highway 4 to John Muir Road, Project No. C1031, to MCK Services, Inc.

BACKGROUND:

Sealed bids were opened by the City Clerk at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 22, 2008. Six bids were received to do the work. The lowest responsible bid was submitted by MCK Services, Inc. The bid summary is as follows:

The low bid of \$559,343.45 is below the engineer's estimate of \$625,280.50 and within available funding. The low bidder, MCK Services, Inc. has a proper and valid contractor's license and has successfully completed similar projects for the City of Martinez and other Bay Area cities.

On January 18, 2006 the City Council authorized staff to submit a grant application to Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) for \$540,000 in federal funds for repaving Alhambra Avenue from Highway 4 to John Muir Road. Staff was successful in obtaining the grant. As part of the five year Capital Improvement Program the Council allocated an additional \$200,000 in Measure C funds for the required local match needed to complete the project. The engineer's estimate of project cost is \$740,000.00.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Alhambra Avenue Paving, Highway 4 to John Muir Road, project was previously budgeted under Account No. C1031 as part of the 2006-07 CIP, adopted June 7, 2007. It is anticipated adequate funds are available to complete the project.

RESOLUTION NO. -08

**ACCEPTING THE BID FOR ALHAMBRA AVENUE PAVING, HIGHWAY 4 TO JOHN
MUIR ROAD, PROJECT NO. C1031 AND AWARDING THE CONSTRUCTION
CONTRACT TO THE MCK SERVICES, INC.**

WHEREAS, the Council allocated funds for the Alhambra Avenue Paving, Highway 4 to John Muir Road, project on June 6, 2007 and as part of the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2006/07 to 2010/11; and

WHEREAS, the City advertised for bids from general engineering contractors; and

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2008, bids were publicly opened and the lowest responsible bid is within the funds allocated for this project; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of the public and the City to implement the Alhambra Avenue Paving, Highway 4 to John Muir Road project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Martinez that the bid by MCK Services, Inc. is hereby accepted in an amount of \$559,343.45 when the required performance bond, labor and materials bond, insurance and other contract documents have been reviewed and approved by the City Attorney, the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a contract for said project with the contractor.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that should lowest responsible bidder fail to deliver all contract documents, fully executed and filled out, so that they are in the hands of the City within ten calendar days after receipt of notice from the City of the City's acceptance of their bid, then the bid shall be deemed in violation of the contract documents and the bid shall be deemed non-responsive and rejected and the City Manager shall execute a contract with the next lowest responsive bidder.

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
