RE: Installation of Batting Cage at Hidden Lakes Baseball Fields

Dear Mr. Tucker,

As we discussed earlier this week, Martinez Youth Baseball & Softball (MYBS) is pursuing a project to upgrade the baseball and softball facilities at the Hidden Lakes fields by installing a batting cage. Attached is a visual representation of the facilities (approximately to scale) that we would like to install. These facilities would consist of the following:

- 74' x 18' concrete pad
- 74' x 18' x 14' chain link cage (to protect the batting cage net)
- Batting cage net, pitching machine, balls kept in Knaack box at the batting cage
- Electrical circuits from the snack shack building to both the batting cage location and the scorekeeper's shack at the lower field
- Rolling gate in the fence near the batting cage location (for construction and future access to the batting cage)

With the permission from the City of Martinez, these facilities would be installed by volunteers and corporate donors from Shell and others as well as funds from MYBS. Depending on availability of our volunteers, we expect that construction would be in the Sept-Nov 2009 timeframe.
