ADULT SPORTS

- Men's C/D Spring Softball completed a seven game season, April 29. Undefeated, Mtz Auto Body won the league title.
- Church League began Monday, May 2. Eight teams will play on two Joe DiMaggio Fields through August.
- Coed and Coed Just For Fun League began Tuesday, May 3. A total of ten teams are playing both leagues.



- Men's D and Men's E Leagues began Wednesday, May 4. Men's D has an eight team league and Men's E has a six team league.
- Teams playing kickball in Walnut Creek have contacted me about starting a summer league in Martinez.



AQUATICS

- Recreation is working with the IT and Personnel Department on the purchase of a photo ID. This system would allow us to make waterproof photo ID summer pool passes.

BROCHURE

- The summer activity guide was completed and downloaded onto the City website May 3. This year we have fifteen camps for all ages and interests. These camps include our own playground program, On the Go Camp, Swim and Nature Camp, and Summer's End.
- Summer activity flyers are being prepared for distribution to local elementary schools.



PICNIC AND BUILDING RENTALS

- To date, Recreation has reserved twenty-four picnic and building rentals since February. People have discovered the new Nancy Boyd Building and like the ability to use the room with the picnic areas.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- Lion's Club Easter Egg Hunt was held at Waterfront Park, April 23. Recreation staff turned the children into Easter Bunnies with a little face paint and a set of paper ears. Children were also able to visit with the Easter Bunny. Staff estimates that approximately 1000 people attended and 400 children had their faces painted.
- Oohs, Ahs and Giggles first show was held May 4. Cow Girl Karen entertained seventy people with her rope and cow girl skills.

YOUTH SPORTS

- After School Soccer has been going well. Games are played at Golden Hills Park and the season will end May 2 with a tournament.
- Preschool Soccer has twenty-five children and Preschool T-Ball has twenty-five children enrolled.
- A boy's baseball tournament was held at Joe DiMaggio Fields, April 30 – May1. Three fields were busy with the boys' tournament. The fourth field was used by Little League and softball teams for practice.
