Subject: August Staff Report

ADULT SPORTS

- Men's D Summer League ended August 3 with a four team double elimination tournament.
- Martinez PD sponsored an eight team area police department tournament, Saturday August 6.
- Church League ended August 2 with an eight team double elimination tournament.

AQUATICS

- Group swim lessons were held morning, late afternoon and evening throughout the month.
- Lap swimming and Water Aerobics were extended to September 30, Monday – Friday, 4 – 8 p.m.
- Throughout August we had numerous maintenance issues, including pumps air locking, backwash equipment not working properly, controller mother board malfunction and leaking heaters. The contractor returned to make adjustments to the system and repairs on the equipment were covered by warranty.
- The pool has become very popular for birthday parties, with up to six parties per day. Clean-up is an issue.
- Pool staff gave countless tours of the facility to walk-ins and pool professionals. Answering questions and demonstrating equipment.
- Landscaping was completed this month.
- Contractors were in and out of the facility. Roll-up doors were replaced and secured. A window was repaired and tile contractors brought in supplies for post shut-down work.
- Staff met with the architect and contractor to discuss punch list items. Reeve-Knight will begin completing the punch list items after the facility is closed.
- August 22, a turtle egg hunt was held at the pool. It soon became clear to the lifeguards that the plastic eggs weren't going to stay in the pool. Within a matter of minutes, the eggs drifted to the gutters and shot across the deck, some entered the parking lot. The kids had a great time gathering eggs and turning them in for prizes. The staff had a good laugh.

BROCHURE

- Staff worked on the Fall 2011 Activity Guide scheduling classes, activities and special events. The brochure was published on the internet and program flyers were sent to the schools.

FIELD PERMITS

- Pleasant Hill/Martinez AYSO was given permits for Hidden Lakes, Waterfront Multi-Use, Golden Hills, Nancy Boyd, Holiday Highlands, Mt View, Morello, and Hidden Valley for the fall season.
- Diablo Coed Soccer League was given permits for Hidden Lakes and Waterfront Multi-use Sunday mornings for an adult soccer program.
- Martinez Youth Football was permitted Waterfront Multi-use for the month of August for

practices.

- Cepeda Baseball and Golden Era Baseball received permits for field use at Waterfront /DiMaggio Fields.

LASTING IMPRESSIONS PRESCHOOL

- The Director is currently accepting enrollment for the fall program. Eleven children were enrolled in the program in August.

SUMMER PLAYGROUND/DAY CAMP PROGRAM

- Nancy Boyd Playground Program came to a close August 12 Daily program attendance averaged around thirty children. Drop-in registration continued to popular. Parents loved the flexibility of dropping off the children on the days they needed or wanted supervised activities. Over a hundred and fifty children participated in this camp.
- Nancy Boyd Playground participated in the Monday morning movies at the Contra Costa Cinemas. Two to three van loads of children would enjoy a movie and popcorn for \$5. Swim and Nature Camp had seventy-nine children enrolled Children participated in hikes, crafts, games, swim lessons, swimming, magic shows and more.
- Eurosoccer Skills Camp was held at Hidden Lakes August 9-13. We are still waiting for a final numbers count from Eurosoccer.
- The following soccer camps were held at Hidden Lakes August 1 -5 UK Soccer Camp; Eurosoccer August 8 -12 and UK August 15 – 19.. These camps rent the facility and work through AYSO.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- Marty O's Movie Night was held at Nancy Boyd Park. Forty people came out to see "Scooby Doo" August 10 and thirty-five attended "Jumanji." In true recreation fashion, the evening ended wildly when the sprinklers and proceeded to soak the crowd and equipment. Next week we will show "Cats and Dogs."
- Restaurant Tour will be held October 8. Robin Agostino and Barbara Patchin have worked very hard to secure seventeen restaurants to participate in this great activity.
- Dynamite Thursdays were held August 4, 11 and 18 at Nancy Boyd Park. The Magic Bill, Mike the Snake Man, and Caterpillar Puppets was enjoyed by sixty-five children and adults.

YOUTH SPORTS

- Staff is preparing the week for a large regional baseball tournament held at all five Waterfront Fields. The tournament is a two day event and will include twenty-four teams in four age brackets.
