Amphitheater

- Barbara Patchin, Recreation Coordinator has booked Mini Motorland for March. Staff expects about 150 preschoolers on battery operated toy cars, trikes and bikes to visit the interactive riding track. Numerous businesses have asked to participate including Les Schwab, Marty O's Catering and Concessions, and ChildTime.

Aquatics

- I began working on the Rankin Aquatic Center Activity Guide.
- I am reviewing materials for the new Red Cross Lifeguard Training Blended Learning Program. The Blended Learning Program is new and will allow students to complete book works and lectures on-line. They will focus on lifeguarding/CPR/AED/first aid skills at the pool.
- The City of Martinez received an award naming the Rankin Aquatic Center an "Outstanding Aquatic Facility from the California Park and Recreation Society, District 3. The award will be shared at the City Council meeting, March 20.
- The Rankin Aquatic Partners also received an award from CPRS, District 3. They were named "Outstanding Volunteers." Their award will also be shared with the City Council March 20 meeting.
